

This is for individuals, 18 and older, who need a short-term (5 days), safe, and secure environment.

Stabilization is for individuals in a crisis for 5 days. During this time, individuals will be meeting with a mental health provider daily and participate in:

- Intervention
- Discharge

- Treatment Planning
- Their Own Admission

Access to a substance abuse therapist for individuals with a co-occurring diagnosis will be available. Once treatment is completed, individuals will be aligned with ongoing resources and services.
